




FLOOR PLAN

FORMATS OF CONFERENCE PRESENTATIONS

Symposia

A symposium is a session lasting 90 minutes that includes between three and five papers that address a common theme. Each symposium is organized by a convenor and there may also be an additional discussant. We encourage delegates to attend the whole of the symposium and to participate in the discussion.

The length of each presentation depends on how many papers are in each symposium: 3 papers: Each presenter has 30 minutes (20 minutes + 10 minutes for questions)

4 papers: Each presenter has 22 minutes (15 minutes + 7 minutes for questions)

5 papers: Each presenter has 18 minutes (12 minutes + 6 minutes for questions)

Oral paper sessions

Oral papers are grouped together in a chaired session. Each presentation in an oral paper session will last 20 minutes (15 minutes for the presentation and 5 minutes for discussion and questions).

The length of each presentation depends on how many papers are in each symposium: 3 papers: Each presenter has 30 minutes (20 minutes + 10 minutes for questions)

4 papers: Each presenter has 22 minutes (15 minutes + 7 minutes for questions)

5 papers: Each presenter has 18 minutes (12 minutes + 6 minutes for questions)

6 papers: Each presenter has 15 minutes (10 minutes + 5 minutes for questions)

Workshops

Workshop sessions last for 90 minutes. A workshop is a session involving interactive learning and the dissemination of training and/ or skills, rather than an extended lecture.

Poster presentations

We encourage poster presenters to stand at their poster during some of the refreshment breaks so that delegates can talk to them about their work. Please follow these guidelines for the posters: Posters have to be size A0 (85 cm wide and 120 cm high- portrait orientation).

Poster should be printed in high resolution. Please do not print the poster on a fabric, to make it easier to hang the poster on the poster wall.

Each poster presenter is responsible for printing their poster and bringing it to the meeting.

Each poster must have a presenter who is required to stand by the poster during the scheduled duration of the poster session to answer questions from attendees.

Emergency Phone Numbers

Emergency Services (Police, Fire, Ambulance): 112

This is the general emergency number in Iceland. Dialing 112 will connect you to the appropriate emergency service, whether it's the police, fire department, or ambulance.

Reykjavik Police: +354 444 1000

This is the non-emergency number for the Reykjavik Police. You can use this number to report non-urgent incidentsor seek assistance that does not require immediate attention.

Hospital (Landspítali): +354 543 1000

The University of Iceland Hospital is the largest hospital in Iceland and serves as a general hospital providing emergency medical services. If you require urgent medical assistance, you can contact the hospital using this number.

Road Assistance: 1777

If you encounter a problem with your vehicle while traveling on Icelandic roads, such as a breakdown or accident, you can call the Road Assistance service for help.

It's important to note that emergency services in Iceland are generally well-coordinated and dialing 112 will connect you to the appropriate emergency response team. However, if the situation is not an emergency or requires specific assistance, you can use the provided non-emergency numbers for further support.
